



Frequently asked Questions for the Mead After School Program

1. If my student isn't in the Mead School District, are they allowed to participate?
 - a. No. This program is designated for students within the Mead School District.
2. Are scholarships available for this program?
 - a. Yes. You will have to apply for a scholarship through our website; if the scholarship is granted, it will last the rest of the calendar year.
3. Will the buses drop my kids off at home after the program sessions?
 - a. Bus transportation will be provided to the school where each session will be held, but parents are responsible for picking up their student after the sessions.
4. Are home schooled students, that live within the boundaries of the Mead School District, allowed in this program?
 - a. Yes. If you have a homeschooled student that is located in the Mead School District, they are encouraged to join. Parents will be responsible for all transportation, to and from the schools.
5. Is it okay if a Mead student attends a different school and wants to join a different sport at a different school? (Ex: the player only wants to play flag football, but it's not available at their school)
 - a. Yes. The parent will be responsible for transportation if a student registers for a program that is not their school.
6. What is the difference between SYSA sports programs and the Mead After School Program?
 - a. SYSA is not an after school program and is offered to anyone in the greater Spokane area.
 - i. Example: A first grader will participate in 6 practices and 6 games and receive a uniform and socks for \$85.
 - b. The Mead Program is an after school program that is only for students within the boundaries of the Mead School District. This program allows for students to work on individual skill development.
 - i. Example: A first grader will participate in 4 soccer training sessions, after school, for \$40.
